Area - 61 acres

Maximum depth - 26 feet

Temperatures: Surface - 75⁰F 23 feet - 53⁰F

Principal fisheries: Brook trout, smallmouth bass

Moody Pond is categorized as marginal for coldwater sportfish due to high water temperatures and heavy competition from non-sport fish. Experimental brook trout stockings have proved fruitful and should be continued unless future stockings fail to provide satisfactory fishing.

A limited amount of smallmouth bass habitat is available which is the reason the population remains low.

An unimproved access site is located on the west shore of the Moody Mtn. Road.
